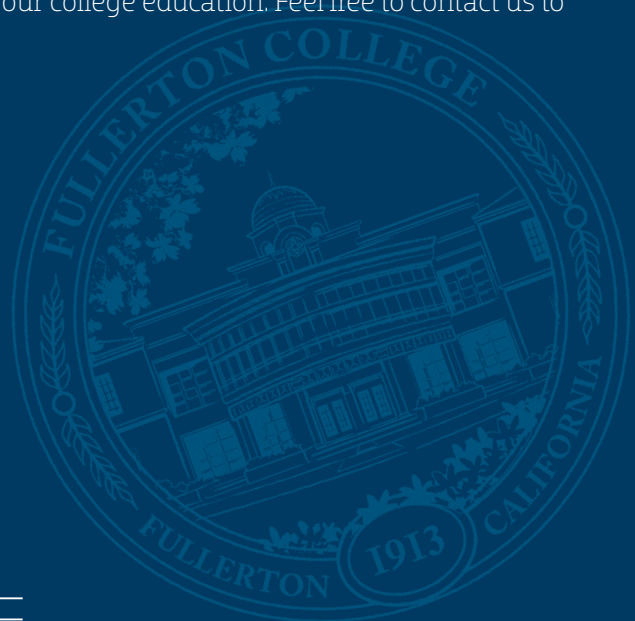

How We Help You Excel...

Academic Support Center:

Helps Fullerton College students achieve academic success in all subject areas by providing instructional support to students and faculty throughout the Skills Center, Tutoring Center and the Writing Center.

Associated Students:

Offers students leadership opportunities, providing a wide variety of campus events that involve the student body and student representation in shared governance.

Cadena/Transfer Center:

Serves as a student resource and advising center which provides a variety of academic, transfer, personal enrichment and diversity services.

Career and Life Planning Center:

Offers individual and group appointments with career counseling faculty and provides students with career information.

Counseling Center:

Offers new, continuing and returning students individual appointments with counseling faculty to receive assistance in reaching educational goals.

Disability Support Services:

Provides support and educational accommodations to qualified students with disabilities. DSS students may also take advantage of the DSS computer lab located in the Library.

EOPS:

The Extended Opportunity Program and Services is a student support services program designed to assist students in meeting their educational and career goals. Also under EOPS is CARE. This supplemental program assists EOPS eligible students who are also the parent of a child under 14 years of age and a TANF recipient.

Financial Aid:

Provides assistance and processing of federal and state financial aid for eligible students.

Health Services:

Provides clinical services, counseling, medical testing, health workshops, and some medications.

Honors Program:

Offers small classes, close faculty interaction, and transfer benefits to academically motivated students.

International Student Center:

Helps students from all over the world with their transition to the United States and in reaching their academic and personal goals.

William T. Boyce Library:

Assists students in attaining their educational and information goals by offering a combination of innovative and traditional library services.

On-site Child Development Center:

This nationally recognized program serves as a high quality environment for preschool-aged children as well as a training and research facility for students from many disciplines.

Student Affairs:

Offers students the opportunity to become involved on campus and in the community.

Veterans Resource Center:

Provides veterans, their spouses and family, active military personnel, and dependents resources to reach success."
